- Ensure 100% of all students from Prep to Year 6 achieve a 'C' or higher in English, Mathematics, Science and Humanities and Social Sciences (HASS) for 2020.
- Ensure that 100% of students engage in the development of computational thinking skills.

Our initiatives include


- Continued participation in the Outback Advantage Cluster and partnership with the Curriculum 2 Classroom team in order to trial and review the P-6 Curriculum Planning Model for Maths, English, Science and HASS units.
- Collaboratively implement a process for regular discussion of student achievement data through formal conversations to reflect on the effectiveness of teaching practice. With a particular focus on Mathematics to deliver pre/post diagnostics aligned to P-6 Maths Units.
- Integrating Technology in a multi-age classroom:
 - Continuing the ongoing partnership with the IMPACT Centre to deliver Technology to Year 4-6 students via elearning.
 - Supporting Outback Advantage Cluster initiatives to integrate Technology in contextualised learning and engaging external providers to deliver Professional Development PD.

Our school will improve student outcomes by

In conjunction with the Outback Advantage Cluster, employ a temporary, part-time Head of Curriculum (HOC) to assist in the organisation of cluster curriculum and three levels of planning for a curriculum framework.	\$1000
Employment of a District Relief Teacher for two days (one per Semester) providing the opportunity for Cluster Teacher and Principal engagement with data and practice to collaboratively formulate future planning based on student progress and need.	\$1000
Registration fees for engagement of IMPACT Centre to deliver Technology to Year 4-6 students.	\$2240
Providing focussed professional development opportunities for staff to build capability to address and enhance curriculum knowledge and teaching practice.	\$1256
